Introduction

Working together, you and your child can create a word book that fosters discussion and collaboration. Coming up with, and reading descriptive words together will help increase your child's vocabulary.

To use your word book, simply write the name of each picture, and all the descriptive words your child can think of for that item. Read through the book with your child and add any additional words they come up with. You can use the picture template provided, or find your own pictures to include.



Supplies

- Picture template
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Cardstock sheets (2)
- Crayons
- Glue stick
- Stapler

Instructions

- 1. Make Your Pages:** Fold each 8.5"x11" cardstock in half, and staple on the fold. Crease the pages around your stapled "spine" so the book lays flat.
- 2. Choose Pictures:** Choose any six (6) pictures you and your child like. If you use our template, have fun coloring!
- 3. Cut and Glue:** Cut out the pictures and glue one picture on each page starting from the inside of the first page.
- 4. Describe the Pictures:** Label each picture, and let your child tell you what descriptive words to write on each page.
